They'll usually be the ones at the altar.

Later in June, Kenny Young will be taking 10 of our men to Tom's River, New Jersey where they'll be helping Pastor

Winchester work on projects at New Life Church. They'll also be doing street ministry on the boardwalk there.

Our His Place guys won't just be doing ministry in Tom's River, while there, our His Place men will also be helping the Baptist Resource Network with ministry in Camden and Philadelphia. This should be quite an experience for some good ole boys from Sweet Home Alabama. Please keep them in prayer.

Our guys will also be helping Rock Springs Baptist Church rebuild their parsonage in Marcoot, Alabama. Yes, there really is

a Marcoot. Our guys will be there.

The His Place guys always love helping Lakeview Baptist's "Carpenters for Christ ". Our guys learn a lot from the

"Carpenters for Christ", and the carpenters always appreciate our guys' strong backs and enthusiasm. Trips like these help the church get to know who His Place really is and what we're all about.

His Place will have the unusual opportunity to host 3 missionary interns from Russia and the Ukraine in June. Talk about faith! Thanks to the Slavic Missionary Bible School in Jacksonville, Florida. This will be our second year with international interns. Serving God means stretching your borders and at His Place we do it!

Within all these outreaches and missions we will still go to church (4x a week); have classes (3x a day); run a farm and help at our thrift store. Our men will cook (and eat) 150-200 meals every day. Most nights will find our men gathered around a campfire singing praises to God and offering prayers up for each other, and...for you—our friends and supporters.

After you've been homeless, addicted, in prison, abandoned and abused, living is easy and blessed.

I miss him. Oh how I miss him. I don't want it to be "Father's Day" yet. I don't know how to do that—yet.

A few years ago, a precious friend of ours had died. Her daughter said, "I don't know what to do. My momma taught me how to do everything but how to live without her."

I understand.

Life now is different. I KNOW where he is. He is with his beautiful Savior and beloved Father.

But I am here, and there's an empty space that his presence used to fill.

I am sad, yes. But I am also so very thankful that all the truth about eternity that my daddy taught me from the time I was so very little, ALL that is the truth I will spend the rest of my live living for and sharing with Others.

Jesus IS the Only Way to The Father. He IS The Truth. He IS The Life. It IS Only by Him that we are set free. And That, my dear friends, is how I stay close to what was the biggest thing about my daddy. He set his course for an eternity in heaven and he showed everyone he could how to follow him as he followed his Christ.

So on this Father's Day, I will miss my daddy but I will remember and share the life he lived, a life in Christ. I love you daddy.
